For Your Study and Reflection This Week **Palm Sunday**

Isaiah 50:4-9a

The Lord GOD helps me;
therefore I have not been disgraced;
therefore I have set my face like flint,
and I know that I shall not be put to shame. (v. 7)

Psalm 31:9-16

But I trust in you, O LORD;
I say, "You are my God."
My times are in your hand;
deliver me from the hand of my enemies
and persecutors. (vv. 14-15)

Philippians 2:5-11

[Christ Jesus] emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
assuming human likeness.
And being found in appearance as a human,
he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death—
even death on a cross. (vv. 7-8)

Mark 11:1-11

Then those who went ahead and those who followed
were shouting, "Hosanna!
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" (v. 9)
